- 1. Subject contribution to running costs covers some of the cost of materials used by your child such as Resistant Technology, Food, Textile Technology and others.
- 2. Please pay the contribution to school running costs at your earliest convenience. Statements are sent out each term and we have a flexible payment system the following methods are offered:
  - (a) Time payment by automatic payment.
  - (b) Bank payment and internet banking.
  - (c) EFTPOS available at the school office.

### 3. Activity Donations:

These donations help offset the cost in providing essential items such as library books, sports and technology equipment.

#### 4. Trust & PTA Donation:

The Queen Elizabeth College Trust donation helps contribute towards scholarships for students from Year 10 to 13 and also for tertiary study.

The PTA donation helps to provide for equipment that is over and above the day-to-day costs. A recent example of this is the purchase of the marquee.

#### 5. Hardship:

Where families may have difficulty in meeting costs, a confidential call to the Deputy Principals would be appreciated.

- 6. **Music Fees:** Tuition is free. Musical instruments can be hired at a cost of \$55.00 per year. Students are required to purchase their own tuition books and there is a charge of \$45.00 for music incidentals such as photocopying, strings, reeds and maintenance of equipment.
- 7. **Sport Fees:** Fees for sport are charged according to the cost of affiliation fees. The Sports Code booklet has more details for your information.
- 8. **IT Card:** Information and technology card which enables your child to have full access to computer facilities the cost is \$10.00.

#### **SCHOOL HOURS**

The school day begins at 8.00am with the school office open. Students are allowed on the school grounds at 8.30am and their school day begins at 9.00am. There are five (5) periods in a normal school day, with the day ending at 3.20pm.

#### **UNIFORM SHOP**

#### **CAFETERIA**

This is open and available to students at interval and lunch-times. A range of food is available and prices are reasonable.

#### PERSONAL GROOMING

We understand that students express their individuality through the clothes they wear, jewellery and hairstyles.

We would like to emphasise that when in school uniform the following applies:

- Hair to be clean, tidy and of a natural shade. Hair dyed bright colours is not acceptable. Hair in unusual hairstyles such as dredlocks, mohawks or rats tails are not permitted.
- Boys are to be clean shaven.
- Tattoos and body piercings (apart from approved earrings) are not to be visible.

#### **MOTOR VEHICLES**

All students wishing to bring a motor vehicle to school must apply to the Deputy Principals for permission for this to happen. A current driver's licence is required.

## **DRUGS & ALCOHOL**

Queen Elizabeth has a no tolerance attitude towards the use of drugs (other than those required for medical reasons), alcohol and tobacco on school grounds, during school related activities and while students are travelling to and from school.
